The Waorani hunter-gatherer paleo diet and derived, native plant fruit-based dietary treatments have been employed in 2020, apparently successfully by Waorani to prevent COVID in the lower Napo amazon. Native medicine has cured modern disease before and understanding how these fruit-based medicines work may help save lives.
